Super speciality GH for children to come up in Guindy

6.5 acres of land identified for ₹487-cr facility, construction to begin in September 2025

THE state government has identified 6.5 acres of land at the King Institute of Preventive Medicine and Research in Guindy for setting up a super speciality hospital exclusively meant for children. The construction will begin in September and the work will be completed in two years, health minister Ma Subramanian

Subramanian along with health secretary P Senthilkumar and Dr MGR Medical University vice-chancellor Dr K Narayanasamy inspected the site on Sunday. Speaking to reporters, Subramanian said the project will

cost ₹487.7 crore. The hospital will have a sixstorey building and will include quarters for

nurses, doctors, and professors, among other facilities. It will have 20 specialities and 750 beds, including 100 for ICU, he added.

Apart from paediatric super speciality departments including medicine, critical care, surgery, and gastroenterology, it will also have higher paediatric super speciality departments including oncology, urology, neurosurgery, and transplant unit, the minister said. It will be constructed with biochemistry, microbiology, pathology and imaging suite diagnostic

labs apart from dialysis unit, endoscopy suite, interventional radiology and other facilities. An announcement regarding an exclusive super speciality hospital for children had been made in the Assembly

earlier.

Flight to London returns after airspace closure

CHENNAI: A British Airways flight that set off for London from Chennai had to return mid-flight due to closure of airspaces after the US launched an attack on Iran. However, the flight departed again after a five-hour delay when the airspaces were opened again.

The flight with 247 passengers on board was slated for departure originally at 5:35am from the Chennai International Airport. It left for Heathrow around 6:05am on Sunday morning.

On receiving information of the closed airspace over the Middle East, the flight was instructed to return to Chennai. After refuelling, the flight took off again by 11am.

A lorry carrying sacks of salt caught fire near Kaniyambadi in Vellore district on Saturday, after one of its tyres burst and the vehicle rammed into the median on the Arani-Vellore highway. According to the Kannamangalam fire and safety personnel, the incident occurred around 10:45 pm as the lorry was en route to Kadapa in Andhra Pradesh.

The vehicle, which was trans-

porting salt, caught fire after its diesel tank allegedly burst in the impact of the collision. The fire quickly spread and engulfed the entire vehicle. However, the driver managed to escape unharmed, and fled the scene, sources said.

Upon information, fire and rescue personnel from Kannamangalam rushed to the spot and battled the blaze for over an hour to bring it under control. Since it

Teen held for phone theft on train at Paranur

NEARLY a month after an IT professional was grievously injured after falling from a moving EMU train while trying to prevent a phone theft near Paranur station, the Government Railway Police (GRP) have arrested Amin Ali (18), hailing from Kannauj in Uttar Pradesh, in connection with the theft.

The incident occurred on May 26, when V Divesh, a resident of Kancheepuram and employee of an IT firm in Guduvanchery, was on his way home after celebrating his mother's birthday. He had boarded the EMU train at Kancheepuram. As the train departed Paranur station, an unidentified man attempted to snatch his mobile phone. Divesh resisted the attempt, but during the struggle, he lost his balance and fell from the moving train. He sustained serious injuries and was left lying on the platform while the thief escaped with the phone.

Passengers and railway staff later rushed him to a nearby hospital in Potheri, where he was treated for his injuries.

The GRP launched an investigation, looking into footage from dozens of CCTV cameras and gathering eyewitness accounts. They found that Ali had fled to Uttar Pradesh. However, further probe revealed that he had relocated and was hiding in Chengalpattu, from where he was apprehended.

He has been remanded in judicial custody.

Katpadi residents decry lack of drainage system, plant saplings in sewage water

RESIDENTS of CM John Street in Katpadi staged a protest on Saturday over the absence of a proper drainage system in their area. In a symbolic demonstration, they planted saplings in the stream of stagnant sewage water flowing along the road.

Speaking to *TNIE*, the residents said they have been demanding the construction of a drainage canal for the past 10 years, but to no avail. K Selvaraj, a 76-year-old resident, said sewage water is constantly stagnant across a 20-ft stretch of the road.

"Elderly people like me are unable to walk outside, and children can't come out to play," he said, adding that the stagnant water also poses a serious risk of disease outbreaks. Despite filing multiple com-

plaints, the residents noted that no action has been taken so far. While they initially planned to block traffic on Chittoor Main Road, they de-

cided to hold the protest within their street after the local councillor promised to resolve the issue within a week, sources said.

'Masseuse', husband held for Three arrested, 560kg gutka

THE Choolaimedu Police have arrested a 'masseuse', Andrea alias Nicola (38), and her husband Gokulakrishnan (40), in connection with a robbery a month back.

The couple was apprehended near Coimbatore on Saturday. Around 10 days back, Naveen Kumar (23) and his grandmother Rekha (60), who were part of the gang, were arrested from Sengottai.

The gang had lured S Charles, a timber trader from Otteri,

with the offer of a private massage at a residence in Choolaimedu. Charles was directed to the house by Rekha, over the phone.

Once he reached the location, he was assaulted by the group, who stole his 20-sovereign gold chain, bracelet, and also coerced him into transferring ₹40,000 via UPI. Charles fainted during the attack after which the robbers fled.

Police recovered ₹2.85 lakh, and with 114g of gold from the suspects, who were sent to judicial custody.

No safety gear, uniforms for workers removing construction debris

FIELD workers engaged in clearing construction and demolition (C&D) waste on city roads are being deployed without basic safety gear or high-visibility uniforms, raising serious concerns over worker safety. This comes at a time when the civic body has intensified streamlining of C&D waste disposal across the city.

The Premier Precision Company is responsible for clearing debris from primary sites and moving it to secondary collection centres. It is then sent to Kodungaiyur (zones 1-8) or Perungudi (zones 9-15) plants for processing. Skid-steer loaders and transporting vehicles are deployed for debris removal, with each vehicle operated by a driver, accompanied by a helper. While the loaders handle the primary

removal of debris, some large and other leftover fragments are often cleared manually by the helpers using basic tools or bare hands. During field visits by *TNIE*, in some places, workers wore no masks

the place being covered in a heavy cloud of dust. No gloves are provided to shield them from any metal or glass shards, and no safety boots are provided even while working near electrical poles and junction boxes, workers said.

A helper on the condition of anonymity said, "At times, we've experienced electric shocks while working near junction boxes or electric poles. Masks are provided rarely. Working amidst heavy dust without a proper mask is really challenging."

"The helpers are also responsible for managing traffic flow during the clearing process, but are not provided with high-visibility uniforms. It is dangerous during nighttime operations," said another worker. They also said that they lack proper identity cards, which often leads to police questioning them when they return home after completing work late at night. "GCC must ensure that contractors provide all workers, with high-visibility uniforms, proper safety gear, official ID cards, and regular salary slips - areas that are often neglected.

GCC officials were unavailable for comment.
